## CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS), created in October 1983, currently has eleven (11) member states, namely Angola, Burundi, Cameroon, the Central African Republic, Congo, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Gabon, Equatorial Guinea, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, and Chad.

The tasks of ECCAS are defined in Chapter II, Article 4 of the Treaty, which stipulates that the aim of the "Community is to promote and strengthen harmonious cooperation and balanced and self-sustaining development in the fields of economic and social activity, in particular in the fields of industry, transport and communication. energy, agriculture, natural resources, trade, customs, monetary and financial matters, human resources, tourism, education, development, culture, science and technology, and the movement of people with a view to achieving collective self-reliance, raising the standard of living of people, increasing and maintaining economic stability, to strengthen the close peaceful relations between the Member States, and to contribute to the progress and development of the African continent".

The ECCAS' Commission was set up in September 2020 and is composed of the Departments and Structures attached.

By Decision N° 09/ECCAS/CCEG/XXVI/24 of 18 October 2024, a General Secretariat was created within the ECCAS' Commission.

The main function of the General Secretariat is to assist the ECCAS' Commission in the accomplishment of its missions and the coordination of support structures.

The General Secretariat is a structure attached to the Commission. It is placed under the authority of a Secretary General.

Also, by decision N° 10/ECCAS/CCEG/XXVII/24 of 18 October 2024, an Office of the Legal Adviser was created as a structure attached to the Commission to replace the Directorate of Legal Affairs.

The Office of the Legal Adviser is responsible for providing centralized and unified legal assistance to the Commission and other Bodies, Institutions and Mechanisms of the Community, contributing to the codification and progressive development of Community law, defending the interests of the



Community in legal proceedings and protecting the tangible and intangible heritage of the Community and exercising depositary functions.

The Office of the Legal Adviser is placed under the authority of the Community Legal Adviser.

It is within the framework of the implementation of the above-mentioned Decisions that it is planned to recruit a Secretary-General and a Legal Adviser of the Community.

Consequently, it is brought to the attention of the nationals of ECCAS' Member States that the positions of Secretary General and Legal Adviser of the Community are to be filled at the ECCAS' headquarters in Libreville, Gabonese Republic for a period of five (5) years, non-renewable.

Each candidate must meet the following requirements:

- Be a national of one of the ECCAS' Member States, Women applications are strongly encouraged.
- Not have previously claimed a different nationality when applying for another job within ECCAS;
- To be of good moral character;
- Possess the professional qualifications corresponding to the job profile in the appendix.
